

Anne Moore

Anne Moore has been coaching soccer in the state of Wyoming for the past 23 years. She began her coaching career at Virginia Tech as an assistant from 1993-1996 and then was the head women's coach at East Tennessee State 1996-1999 before coming to Wyoming. As the Head Women's Soccer Coach at the University of Wyoming from 1999-2008 Anne was the 2002 Mountain West Coach of the year for the team's second place finish. During her tenure, she also ran Anne Moore Soccer Camps at the University of Wyoming. Following her career at UW, Anne was the Wyoming State Director of Coaching where she was charged with running the Olympic Development program, coach education and player development programs for 5 years. She has also coached on the Region IV staff, presented at the US Youth Soccer Convention, and is currently the Laramie High School Boys soccer coach. Anne grew up playing in the Washington DC area competing for state titles, Youth National Championships, and later NCAA championships as a player at North Carolina State University.

Isaiah Jackson

Isaiah grew up in Laramie playing for the Laramie Blizzard Soccer Club and participated in the Wyoming Olympic Development program until high school. He moved to Texas for his freshman year of high school and then returned to Laramie where he made the Colorado Rush Academy team. He moved to the Denver area to live with a host family while playing for the academy team and received a full scholarship to play division I soccer at Gonzaga University. Following his college career where he was a 4 year starter, Isaiah attended several combine tryouts and travelled to Spain with the hopes of making a professional team. When he didn't receive an offer, Isaiah returned to Laramie to coach the girl's high school soccer team in 2021 and then the boy's high school team in 2022.

Michael Zuniga

Michael grew up in Laramie playing for the Laramie Blizzard Soccer club until his family moved to Cheyenne where he played high school for East as both a field player and goalkeeper. He was recruited to play goalie at LCCC in 2016 and then transferred to finish his degree at the University of Wyoming. Michael has trained both the boys and girls high school goalies for the past 4 years and was on staff with the boys team during the 2022 season. This season both the boy's and girl's high school goalkeepers earned Regional and All-State honors under his leadership.
